School Profile

Community: Waco, with 234,906 residents (MSA), is located in Central Texas and is home to Baylor University, McLennan Community College and Texas State Technical College. It is situated halfway between Dallas and Austin, along I-35.

School: Reicher Catholic High School, founded in 1954 by the Diocese of Austin, serves an economically and ethnically diverse population providing an excellent education at an affordable cost. Current enrollment in grades 9-12 is 230. Reicher's ethnic breakdown is 65% White; 30% Hispanic; 2% Asian; 1.5% Black; .5% American Indian; 1% Other.

Faculty: There are 29 teaching faculty. The teacher:student ratio is 1:8.

Mission: Reicher educates each student in Spirit, Mind and Body by fostering personal excellence within the Catholic tradition.

Accreditation: Reicher Catholic High School is accredited by the Texas Catholic Conference Education Department (TCCED) which is a department of the Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops and receives its accrediting authority from the Texas Education Agency (TEA).

Memberships: National Catholic Education Association, Texas Association of Private & Parochial Schools

The mission of Catholic Education in Texas is the fulfillment of the educational ministry of the Catholic Church and has as its primary goal the continuous formation of the Christian person. Reicher's identity is uniquely Catholic. The entire school community gathers daily for Morning Prayer and for Mass on Fridays, and prayer begins every class, sporting event, and meeting. An annual retreat is provided for each grade level. Catholic Identity is evident in our curriculum as faith forms our understanding in every academic discipline and students take four years of Catholic Theology. The student body also contributes over 4,000 hours of community service each year. Significantly, the aspect of our mission students and families mention most is the "family spirit"—or what we call "community."

† MIND

Catholic educators say, "Our mission is to get students into heaven first – then into Harvard." Most families choose a Reicher education, even if they are of other faiths, because they seek an excellent college preparatory education. As a result of Reicher's rigorous curriculum, students are ambitiously applying and being accepted to competitive colleges, both in and out of state. Every senior takes the SAT and/or the ACT and the average scores on both tests exceed the state and national averages.

† BODY

Reicher's outstanding athletic and fitness programs have led to 17 State Championships in 8 sports over the last ten years. Our athletic success is due to the program's inclusive philosophy—every student who wishes to participate can participate. This philosophy supports Reicher's sense of community while strengthening students physically, socially and emotionally.

STEPPING UP TO CHALLENGES

We can always count on God's everlasting love. We can also count on change. During the 2010/11 academic year, Reicher has experienced both, and each pushed us to grow and improve. It has been a challenge, but Reicher certainly stepped up to meet it. These challenges came in many forms – increased competition, demographics, economic conditions, and staffing to name a few. Most changes were a result of Reicher's increasing enrollment. With a larger student body, the school moved from TAPPS 3A to the next higher level of TAPPS 4A. While it may seem to be just one step up, we entered a whole new world, especially since we went from being one of the largest schools in our division to being the smallest. In particular, we entered a division where most of the schools are more than twice our size. Now, that's a challenge!

True to form, Reicher students stepped up, studied, and played hard. In 2009/10 Reicher earned State Championship titles in six sports. This past year, even with smaller numbers and occasional injuries, the Cougars made it to state level competition in four sports and earned many individual honors, including boys who now hold the state track record in the 4 x 400. The Reicher Academic Team, 2010 State Champions, also moved up a division. Competing with only 7 students, this year's group came within one point of retaining their title. State Runner-up in a very challenging district is quite an accomplishment. Great job!

A new division also meant more travel for our academic, fine arts, and athletic teams. In many cases, our travel time doubled to away games and events. This too presented a challenge. Besides added transportation expenses, travel meant increased time away from school. Always motivated and resourceful, many of the students learned how to do homework by cell phone light on the way home.

As with most of the population, the economy presented another challenge. At Reicher, this has meant an increasing need for tuition assistance. In support of the school's mission to keep excellent Catholic education accessible and affordable, Reicher's generous donors contributed over \$270,000 last year. This money helped families keep their students at Reicher, and also allowed a number of students to come to Reicher for the first time. We are deeply grateful to all who support the Reicher Annual Appeal.

During the past school year, we also experienced the challenge and consequent blessing of a number of new teachers. Due to retirement, sabbatical, relocation, and added class requirements in Math, Technology, and German, Reicher required 10 new faculty and staff. New team members brought fresh ideas and energy to our dedicated and caring staff, and the students successfully managed the changes.

Most people agree that change can be difficult, but with it comes the opportunity to see what you are made of and to learn something important about yourself. This is the case for Reicher. The Cougar Nation can be proud of the way we stepped up to the challenges and now take our lessons and new-found strengths into the the new school year. Watch out for the Cougars!

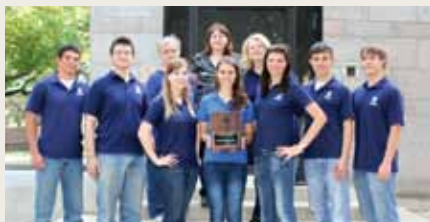

SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Spiritual formation at Reicher is built on four charisms: **RESPECT**, **DISCIPLINE**, **EXCELLENCE**, and **SERVICE**. Each class focuses on a particular charism throughout the year. The student body also participates in over 4000 hours of Christian service annually. Campus Ministry includes: Prayer and Gospel reflection each morning as a community, Eucharist twice weekly, and class and school-wide retreats. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the Sacrament of Reconciliation are also celebrated. Special services are held on First Fridays and Holy Days with St. Louis School. St. Mary's School, West, is also included during the school year. We are blessed to have the full-time ministry of **Deacon Jeff Heiple**, along with the active support of various local pastors. **Sr. Natalie Marengo D.C.**, though retired, remains an important part of student life and alumni relations.



THE CLASS of 2011

For the past 10 years, 100% of Reicher graduates have been accepted to colleges and universities.

All fifty-one members of the **Reicher Class of 2011** maintained this tradition. They successfully completed the Texas Recommended Plan or higher degree plan from the state, and 37% graduated with the Distinguished Achievement Plan, the highest plan offered in Texas. This group was awarded more than \$3.3 million in scholarships, and ten percent were recruited college athletes. Universities and colleges they will attend include: Notre Dame, Rice, Naval Academy, Trinity, Nebraska, Arkansas, UT Austin, Texas A&M College Station, Texas Tech, Texas State, TCU, Baylor, and MCC. The class Valedictorian was **Chris Gerik** (Notre Dame) and the Salutatorian was **Mahek Vellani** (Baylor). The Community Service Award went to **Ashley Poston** (Trinity).

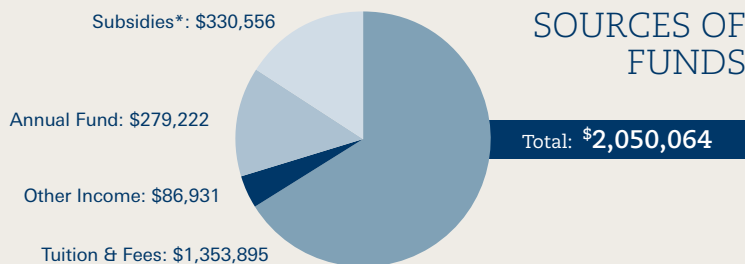
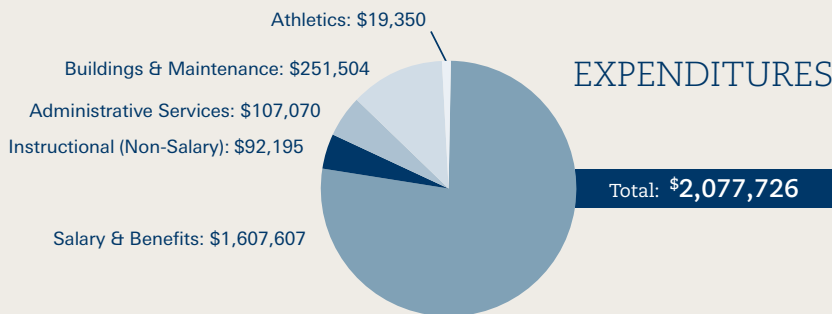

Forecast: These totals include estimates for the year ended June 30, 2011. Projections are based on the actual amounts for the 11 months ended May 31, 2011. The projected deficit of \$27,660 is consistent with the budgeted deficit of \$30,000 due to unfunded increased need for tuition assistance.

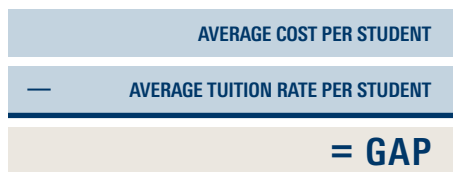

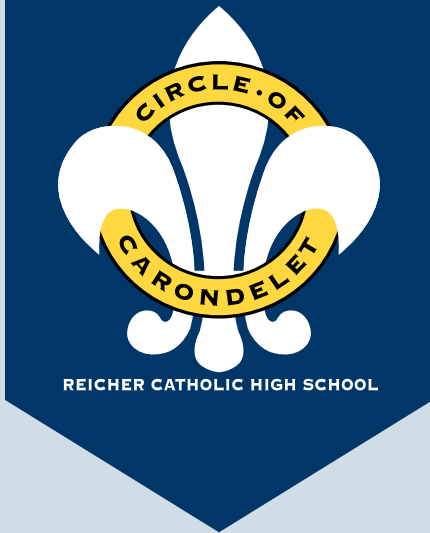

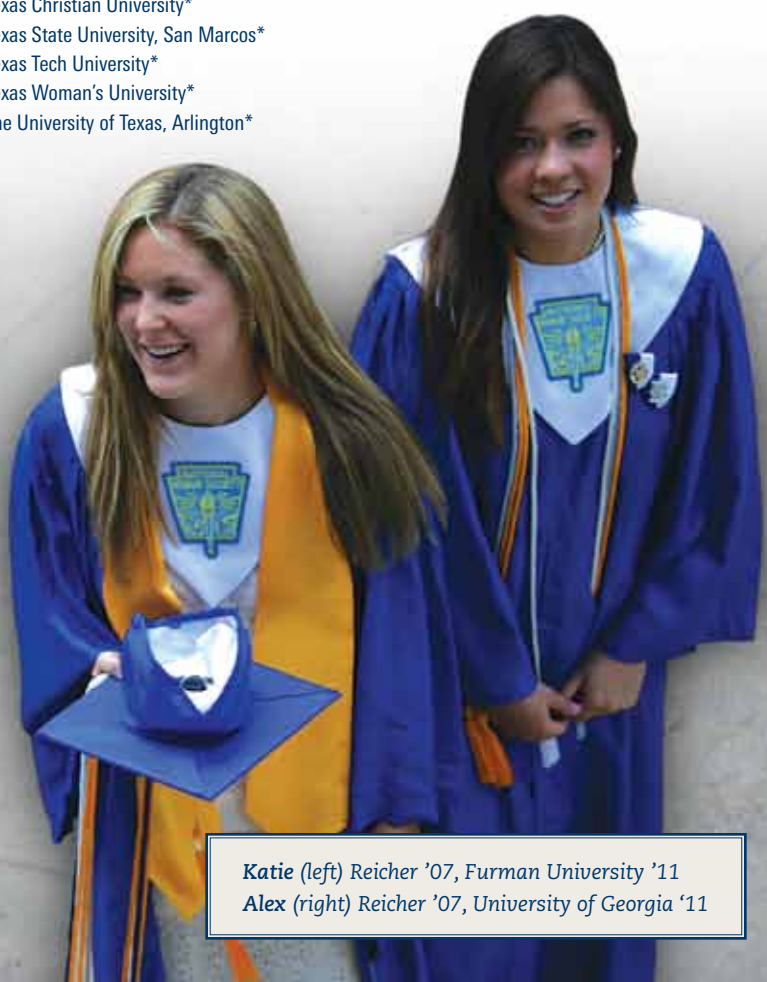
